## Mr. Falk: Grades 7-8

# SPECIAL MEALS

Volunteer parents prepare 4 special hot meals throughout the school year - Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, and the End of Year Picnic.

The menu is listed below for each of the meals. Families have TWO options:

1. If your child would like to partake in ALL of the special meals, the cost is \$14.00 for the first child. For additional children per family that would like all the meals, the cost is \$12.00 each.
2. If a student would like to partake of one, two, or three of the meals, the cost for each individual meal is \$4.00 each, per child/family, with no discount for additional children.

A form is coming home with each student to mark either ALL meals, or the individual meals desired. Please do not put multiple students on forms. Please also indicate on the form if your child has any food allergies or special dietary restrictions. Forms (one per child) and payment (can be combined) for meals are due in the office by Friday, November 6th. So we can plan accordingly, this will be the only time to sign up for meals.

- If you do not have a student account, cash or checks are accepted - please make checks payable to First Lutheran School.
- If you wish to pay using your student account, please indicate amount to be taken from the account on the Special Meals sign up form.
- If your child would like to participate in the meals, but the family is financially unable to, please contact Mr. Falk or the office.

The Wednesday News will have information and dates of each of the meals when they are coming up. We are always looking for help with the meals - please watch the newsletter for contact information if you care to help! Please contact the office with any questions.
