# **Love is More Than Words**

"I love you!" When spoken from the heart these three words express the affection and the love you feel for someone. Wives and husbands say them to each other. Parents say this to their children, but how do you know the speaker actually means them? How is the one who is supposedly loved know they are loved? Those words can be spoken with no real love behind them. Love is more than just words. Love is action that displays love that is in the heart. Consider God's love for you.

Throughout Scripture, God tells us how much he loves us. That love for every single person in this world led him to make a promise to send the Savior that we desperately needed. Yet what would have happened if God didn't send that Savior? Would we know God loved us? Could we even know what love is. If his love for us was only in words, but not in action, than we would have no hope of forgiveness, no hope of life, no hope of salvation because God who describes himself as love did not really love.

God didn't just tell us he loves us. He also showed his love. The Apostle Paul writes, "But God *demonstrates* his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8) When it comes to God's love, his love was more than just words spoken to a broken people. It was love in action. Jesus was the embodiment of God's love. He loved us so much that he demonstrated it by sending his one and only Son to die for us our sins and endure the punishment our sins rightly deserve. God says to you, "I love you," through his Word and then through that same Word he shows you his love in the outstretched arms of Jesus. We know what real love is because God demonstrated it and continues to demonstrate it every day in so many ways.

So what does that mean for our love? You know the old saying. Actions speak louder than words. Too often our love for others is only in saying those three words that roll off the tongue sometimes. Words expressing love are easily said, and they very important to say. Yet no matter how many times you say them, actions will always speak the love that is in the heart. Yes, it is important to say how much you love someone, but in a way it is more important to demonstrate your love.

Since we are loved by God, we are filled with love for others, love that takes action. It is demonstrated in so many ways among all the relationships we have with each other - spouses, families, your church family. Instead of listing how exactly you can show those three words in your life, consider this question. "I am loved by God. How can I demonstrate my love for \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ in my life?" The answer may not be the same for every person in your life. Yet no matter how you answer that question, love is always more than just the words that we speak to one another. Love is demonstrated. Love is lived every single day. Why? Because "God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."
