# Who Was Fooled?

"April fools!" Nobody likes to hear those words. If someone says it to you on the first of April, you know that something has been done to fool you. People play practical jokes, pranks, and various hoaxes on others to get them to feel foolish for having fallen for those tricks. People enjoy playing April fools jokes on others, but those who have been fooled don't necessarily feel the same joy. This year Easter Sunday happens to fall on April Fools Day. When Jesus rose from the dead, there were many who were shown to be fooled. Who was fooled at the resurrection of Jesus?

The Pharisees and Sadducees fooled themselves vehemently opposing Jesus. They rejected Jesus as the promised Messiah. They were fooled into believing they had gotten rid of Jesus when his lifeless body was hanging on that cross. Judas fooled himself with the lure of greed betraying Jesus into the hands of those who had already rejected him. Pontius Pilate fooled himself into thinking that he could wash his own hands of guilt with simple water and that the controversy could be resolved by sealing his tomb. Those who mocked Jesus and insulted him as he hung on the cross fooled themselves by what they thought they saw. "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One." (Luke 23:35)

Have we been fooled? Have we fooled ourselves into believing that the resurrection of Jesus gives us hope of life after death when that hope doesn't exist? The Apostle Paul writes to assure us that we have not been fooled nor have we fooled ourselves when we place our trust and hope in Jesus.

**"If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men. But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man." (1 Corinthians 15:19-22)**

The facts are clear. If Jesus had not been raised from the dead and his bones still lay in that dark tomb, we who have put our hope in Christ could be considered fooled. Easter is the proof that our sins have been paid for and forgiven. Without Easter, we should be pitied as fools in this world. Yet Paul makes it clear we have not been fooled by placing our hope in Jesus. We are not the fools to be pitied.

Jesus, who died on Good Friday suffering the wrath and punishment of our sin, has indeed been raised from the dead. We have hope in Christ. Death came into this world because of one's man sin. Where sin is present, death is right there to follow. Conversely, life is through one perfect man, one perfect sacrifice - Jesus. Because of Jesus' resurrection to life after he breathed his last, we have certain hope. God accepted Jesus payment of sin. We will rise to life in heaven when we fall asleep in death. We are not the fools nor have we been fooled. The stone of Jesus' tomb was rolled away to show us just what the angel said to the women is true, "He is not here. He has risen." Our sins are paid for by Jesus' death and proof is given at that empty tomb which the angel invites us to look into, "Come and see the place where he lay." (Matthew 28:6)

## **Prayer of the Day for Easter Sunday:**

Almighty God, by the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you conquered death and opened the gates to eternal life. Grant that we, who have been raised with him through baptism, may walk in newness of life and ever rejoice in the hope of sharing his glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be dominion and praise now and forever. Amen



**NEEDED: Treadle Sewing Machines for Lutheran Sewing Institute and Community Center in Haiti**

Since the 2010 earthquake in Haiti which killed over 100,000 people, our WELS Haiti mission has worked with many orphans and poor families with many children. Today in Haiti, when an orphan living in an orphanage, reaches 18 years of age, Haitian law dictates that they leave the orphanage. As most orphans have not learned any marketable skills, many young women fall into prostitution and many young men fall into criminal activity to generate some income.

Through a generous donation, our WELS Haiti mission has recently constructed two large classrooms to create a Lutheran sewing institute and community center. Both women and men will be able to learn to sew in order to hopefully help support themselves.

The center will be open for people to both learn to sew and, for a very nominal fee, rent time on a machine to complete a sewing project. Even more importantly, everyone coming to the center will come in contact with the life changing gospel message of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. The sewing institute and community center are designed to be outreach tools to an area surrounded by Vodou temples.

As there is no reliable electricity in the area of Haiti where we work, we need to use treadle sewing machines – the kind your grandmother or great grandmother may have used for sewing! If you have an old treadle sewing machine that you could donate to our Haiti Lutheran sewing institute and community center, please contact us through your pastor.

We can arrange to pick up your old machine. The donation may also be tax deductible. Thank you, brothers and sisters!

## **Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) Report**

The LWMS Southern Lakes Circuit held their Spring Rally on Sunday, March 11 here at First Lutheran. Pastor Heuer opened with a devotion based on Psalm 32. Our sins are forgiven if we confess and believe in Jesus, our Savior.

Our guest speaker was Pastor Philip Henselin, the executive director of Institutional Ministries. His career has spanned being a parish pastor, a volunteer police/fire chaplain, on the Board of Institutional Ministries and now as director. There are seven chaplains that do the work throughout the state of Wisconsin with the majority of prisons located thru the middle of the state. Institutional Ministries work in adult and juvenile correctional facilities, drug and alcohol treatment centers, give post-institutional support, and go to healthcare, extended care and mental health facilities. Pastor Henselin touched on each of these programs and said that their ministry is a slow process – it takes time for the Gospel to work. They are always sharing hope with those who need it most! We had 46 in attendance. Thank you to the ladies of First for serving refreshments. The tables were decorated with 53 small flags that represent all the countries where the WELS is involved or has fellowship with the national synod.

During the business meeting, we held election of officers for Vice President – Priscilla Kopczynski, Faith, Antioch; Secretary – Bonnie Conrad, St. John's, Burlington, Spiritual Growth Woman – Darlene Kohlman, Trinity, Union Grove and Spiritual Growth Pastor – Pastor James Fischer, Peace, Wilmot. We also voted for where our Mission offerings would be going. The World mission project will be Central Africa Medical Mission (CAMM) for Fall and the Home mission project will be Hispanic Training Support and Scholarship for Spring, 2019. The circuit will be sending Brittany Gauger, Zion, Bristol, as our Send One Sister recipient to the LWMS Convention in June in Green Bay, WI. Carla Baudais, Alice Lembach and Deb Buelow will be attending the Convention from our congregation.

The Fall Rally will be at Peace, Wilmot the end of September or early October. The topic is sharing God's Word in Africa.

## The March 7, 2018 Ladies Aid Minutes

We began with praying the table prayer. Sandy Walter and Marge Heller served Pastor Heuer and fourteen members.

Pastor Heuer then gave the devotion reading I Corinthians 10:12 & 13. Even when you think you are firm in your faith, be careful that you do not fall.

Beverly Freitag opened the meeting asking for the treasures report.

Doris Salem said we now have \$2556.90 total in checking and savings.

Vickie Muller sent a sheet around for finalizing the meal the Aid is serving for at the the Wednesday night Lenten Service on March 21<sup>st</sup>. She also sent a sheet around to give those that were not present last month a chance to sign up for befriending a shut-in in our congregation with prayer, cards, visits. She said next month we would have a chance to sign up for Easter Flowers.

Carla Baudais also gave us a sign up sheet for this coming Sunday's LWMS Rally being held here at First Lutheran still needing fruit plates. Tables are being brought in from another church. The church will also be used for the children's school projects display in the gym, and the book sale the same day. Registration will be done by Doreen Grahams, Vicki and Doreen will set food out at 3:00. Flags representing all the countries that WELLS is affiliated with will be on the tables. Between the church door donation, the Aid's standing donation of \$150, and the LWMS jars filled at each meeting, we will give \$325 for prison ministries.

Nancy Haak gave a report telling us that the monies given for the Library has not been spent (\$716) and is in a savings account. The money is going to be put back into the Aid savings account marked for Library use. We will not be giving the \$50 standing donation to the church library anymore. Before eliminating any books, Nancy Haak and Laura Kuehl will check with our teachers and Pastor as to what books should be kept, and if there are other books needed for the library.

Vickie Muller suggested we donate money helping Sandy Christian with things she can use for the "Wrap Around Program." Children come as early as 6:30 in the morning.
